PLANS FOR THE MANOR HOUSE



Sevenoaks District Council has received a planning application for the Manor House—formerly the Bovis Homes Ltd Head Office.

The plans are for the partial demolition, extension and alteration of the existing office building, including retained office use (Use Class B1a) in the Grade II listed Manor House.



The conversion and extension of the modern parts to 49 one and two bedroom apartments and the erection of 4 new 3 bedroomed houses.

The Parish Council will comment on this proposal which will be considered at the Planning Committee meeting to be held on 01 August 2019 at 9.30am in the viewing gallery of Ash Green Sports Centre. The Parish Council will consult near neighbours. LISTED BUILDINGS IN THE PARISH—THE WHITE SWAN

The White Swan Public House was listed as Grade II in 1982. It is a 17th century or earlier timber-framed building, now roughcast. It is two storeys high and has a steeply pitched, hipped, old tiled roof with a gablet on one side. There are three later casement windows and a modern extension.

In the early years of its history, the White Swan was known as just The Swan. It seems the “White” was added at some time around the beginning of the twentieth century.

In 1792 The Swan was occupied by a William Sharp and owned by a Mr Stevens. Over the next twenty or so years none of the licensees stayed for long.

By 1839 The Swan and 9 acres of land was owned by Charles and William Fleet but the publican was Richard Wakeman. The Wakeman family were in residence at the Swan for almost 50 years.

Richard was born and bred in Ash and was 48 in the 1841 census, living in the Swan with his wife Martha and 5 children. By 1851 he was also shown as a farmer. Between 1852 and 1859 he bought the western part of the gardens associated with Vineyard Cottages and between 1863 and 1868 he had built Flint Cottage, where an earlier school once stood.

During this period Richard took in paying guests and in the 1861 census two interesting visitors were shown, William Jenkins and John MacMaster, both civil service ordnance surveyors, no doubt surveying the area in preparation for the first Ordnance Survey map.

On Richard Wakeman's death, he was succeeded as licensed victualler by his daughter Elizabeth and on her death by her sister Martha. Martha and Elizabeth Wakeman made and sold penny custard pies every day all through Lent. The pies were called "pudding pies" and many school children bought them.

Martha had two sons, William and Robert who duly inherited from her. They were no longer in The Swan by 1891 but may have retained ownership of the land on the other side of Billet Hill. Other licensees included Tom Venner in 1891 and Richard Lane in 1901 and Mr Burt in 1911.

According to the WI book of Ash (1957), “The original inn was smaller and there were no counters in those early days. Under where now the bottle shelves are erected there was a large open fireplace and customers sat on barrels arranged in a semicircle around the fire. The drinks were brought up from the cellars in jugs. We know that over a century ago it was the meeting place of the Manor Courts. Just near the counter of the present saloon bar there is a small door in the wall which when opened discloses a sizeable cavity which suggests that it was a hiding place used in days gone by for those seeking refuge or as a place for hiding valuables. Great oak beams and low ceilings and doorways are a feature of the house. In 1938 a fire caused quite a bit of damage. A fire in the chimney was the cause of the general conflagration. The Eynsford Fire Brigade attended, the firemen finding their task made the more arduous by reason of the fact that several massive beams were well alight, through which they had to saw. When the flames had been mastered there were found in the roof piles of straw, the remains of the old thatch, which had not even been set alight”.



All sorts of people can be on-call firefighters... and we want to hear from you!

On-call firefighters are paid to be available for an agreed number of hours. During that time you can go about your normal life at home or work, but if you get a call to say we need you, you must be able to drop what you are doing and get to the station within 5 minutes. The hours we offer will be based on what the local station needs to deal with the risk in your area. To be an on-call firefighter, you must: \diamond be at least 18 years old, \diamond be physically fit \diamond live or work within 5 minutes of the station.

MEET YOUR POLICE & CRIME COMMISSIONER



Matthew Scott, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Kent, is coming to New Ash Green to meet and listen to local people.

His job is to set policing priorities for the county, by consulting with the public and putting together a Police and Crime Plan. He then holds the Chief Constable of Kent to account for the delivery of that plan. The Commissioner decides the amount of council tax that goes to policing and he sets the overall policing budget. In addition, he provides services for victims of crime and funds community safety projects.

This is your chance to tell the Commissioner what you want to see the Police doing in our area. How can they be more effective in fighting crime and dealing with offenders? What Police resources do we need in New Ash Green, Hartley and Longfield? Which crimes should they be concentrating on?
