#### The Green Man

After the Parish Council listed The Green Man as an Asset of Community Value following its tragic fire. We received notification from the landowner; the Stonegate Group of their intention to dispose of the site. This triggered a six-month moratorium period in which the 'Green Man Recovery Group' attempted to reach out to the landowner to discuss their intention for the site and/or consider forming their own bid.

Sadly despite the best efforts of the Recovery Group and with the support of the local press, they were still unable to get Stonegate Group to engage with them.

The six-month period expired and within hours, the Stonegate Group confirmed they planned to put the site on the open market.

The Recovery Group continues to try and engage with the landowner.

#### **Youth Club**

The Parish Council commissioned Youth Club, that will be run by KCC is intended to relaunch in Autumn 2022.

At the moment we are currently arranging a venue. We will keep residents informed with more progress in due course.



#### Ash & Ridley WI **Doris Ashton**

28th Nov 1926 - 13th Feb 2022

Many of our residents will remember Doris, so here is a short piece about her life, culled from various sources including my own memory, but mainly from what her daughter Charlotte said about her at the recent Memorial Service held at St Peter & St Paul's Church. Ash on 4<sup>th</sup> May. when Doris's ashes were interred in the grave of her late husband, George.

Doris was born in South East London. Her father was a City of London policeman. He was keen on music and sports and encouraged his daughters to swim by taking them, before breakfast, to the swimming baths close to where they lived in the Old Kent Road. Sometimes they would watch the police water polo team practising. Doris did so well that she was awarded the under 12s South London Championship Medal.

With the outbreak of War, she was evacuated first to Worthing and then to Rickmansworth Girls, where she became part of the Land Army. She had an aptitude for sciences and wrote to ICI to apply for a job as a lab assistant. Later she moved into publishing and by 1949 she was a sub -editor. In 1960, having moved to a photographic magazine she met George who was to become her husband. They enjoyed going to the theatre, the Proms and watching cricket at the Oval. By this time, she was working at the Readers' Digest and was involved with books on gardening, birds and wildlife.

Together they moved to Ash in 1963/4 to a house in Wallace Terrace where Doris lived for thirty years, tending the big garden and getting involved in village life. In about 1966 Doris joined the WI and soon joined

committee, being at various times Treasurer,

President and a District Rep for Hartley District. In 1969 she sang in The Brilliant & the Dark by Malcolm Williamson & Ursula Vaughan Williams at the Royal Albert Hall as part of the WI choir: it was something she often referred to with great pride and affection. Doris made lots of friends with the WI and it was Doris who welcomed me as a new member when she was doing a stint as President c1980.

Latterly, she moved to New Ash Green when her garden in Ash got too big to manage and created a lovely garden there which included a pond. Only last spring Doris rang me in great excitement to announce the arrival of frog spawn and I went to view it so that she could share her enthusiasm with the rest of our members by writing about it in a WI newsletter. It was, of course, a challenging time for all of us, when we weren't allowed to meet.

Doris enjoyed many special interest holidays, courses at Denman, the former WI college, her membership of the RSPB, involvement with Gravesham Choral Society and lived independently until the end of her life. In fact, it was only in January this year that she managed, with great pleasure, and with Charlotte's assistance, to join a WI Zoom meeting for the first time.

A long life lived independently with stoicism and humour.
